Keynote Speakers:



Javier Moro is a celebrated Spanish author with ten book publications worldwide. He received the prestigious Premio Planeta Award – the most valuable award in the world after the Nobel Prize in Literature – for his novel "You are the Empire". His novel, "Indian Passion", the story of a Spanish dancer who married the Maharajah of Kapurthala, has been translated into seventeen languages.



Robert Filback, Ph.D. is Professor of Clinical Education and Chair of the Master of Arts in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (MAT—TESOL) program. His areas of focus include international education, language teacher preparation, online and technology enhanced learning and creativity as well as innovation in education. He teaches courses at master and doctoral levels and regularly chairs dissertations.



Donna Brinton, MA is a private educational consultant based in Beverly Hills, CA. In the past, she served as Senior Lecturer in the Rossier School of Education at the University of Southern California (USC), where she designed and taught online classes in the MAT-TESOL program. Prior to that, she served as Professor of TESOL at Soka University of America, and as Lecturer in Applied Linguistics, as well as Associate Director

of the Center for World Languages at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). She taught a wide spectrum of Applied Linguistics and English as a second language classes. Donna is the co-author and co-editor of numerous professional texts.

Zsuzsa Londe, Ph.D. got her BA in Linguistics (summa cum laude), and MA and Ph.D. in Applied Linguistics (UCLA). Working memory and its relationship to listening comprehension in a second language was the topic of her dissertation.
